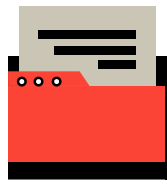

Programs and Activities

Woman Empowerment



The project to empower indigenous women in the BENI territory to combat gender-based violence has borne incredible fruit. This project was carried out for 8 months and resulted in tangible results in awareness-raising, training and agriculture.

Support for the training of 20 women in seam cutting. We give for them materials and pay their trainer.

We provide more support to indigenous women who are the most victims. We train and support them by paying for their training, giving them materials and offering them a little capital to get started their own activities.

We just opened a cutting and sewing center in BENI.

Impact : 20 women's life have been improved. They became autonomous by providing for their own needs.

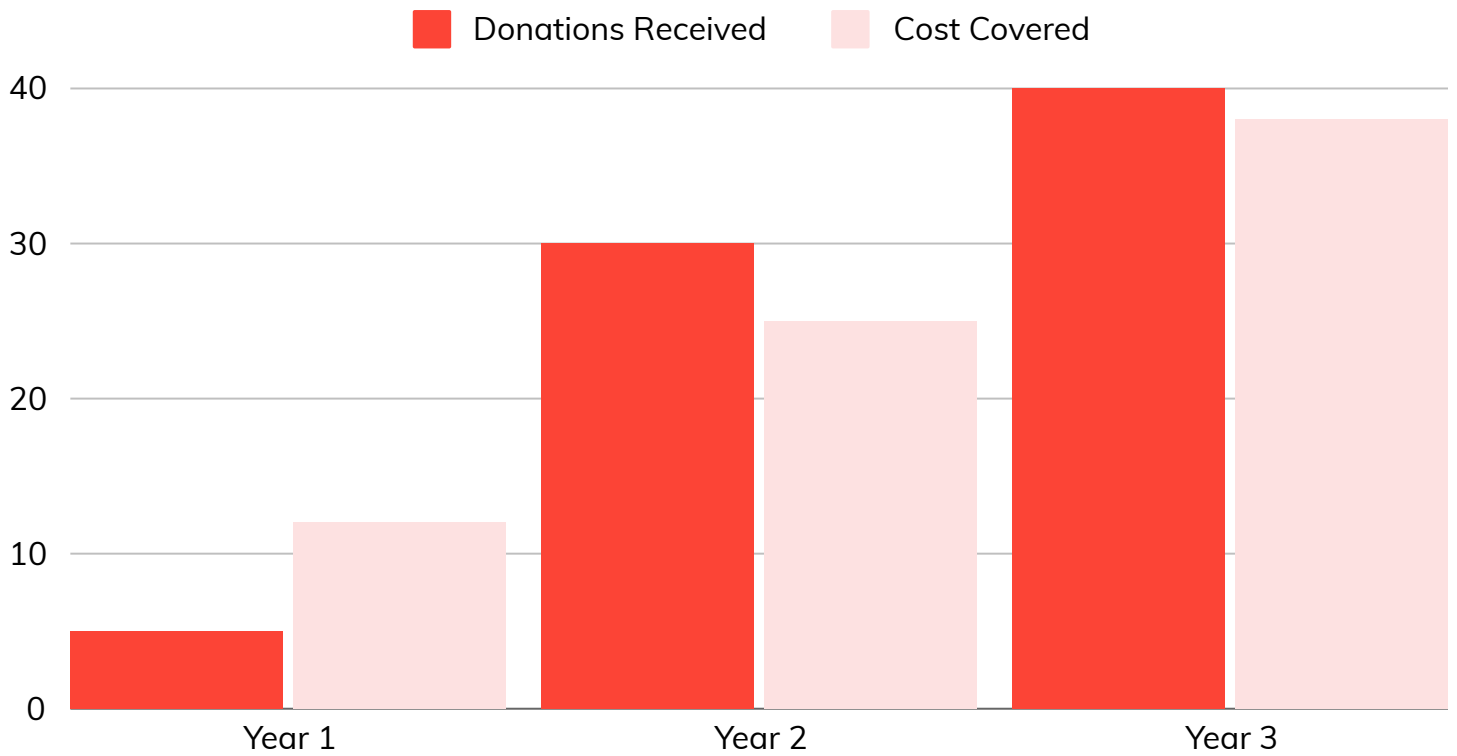


If we do not take care of our planet, all life will disappear. The image above reminds us of our awareness of the ecological transition in all our ways of doing and acting.
